

We believe companies with a demonstrated history of consistent growth & stability in earnings can provide attractive returns with moderate risk over the long term.



## **Summary of Guidelines**

### St. Lucie County Fire District Firefighters' Pension Fund

### **Objective**

- To obtain a reasonable total rate of return, commensurate with the Prudent Person Rule. To obtain reasonable consistency of returns judged over a three to five year period. Protection of capital against the erosion of inflation and wide swings in the value of assets.
- Returns are expected to exceed the Russell 1000® Growth Index over a three to five year period and rank in the top 40<sup>th</sup> percentile of an appropriate universe.

#### **Guidelines**

- The Benchmark is the Russell 1000® Growth Index.
- A maximum of 5% at market may be invested in any one stock.
- The aggregate investment in any one company shall not exceed 5% of the outstanding stock.
- Up to 25% may be held in foreign stocks and ADR's, as long as traded on a US exchange.
- Do not purchase companies listed as "scrutinized companies" by the FL SBA under the Protecting Florida Investments Act (PFIA).

### Trading

• When possible, without sacrificing best net price and execution, trades should be directed to Cowen Execution Services. Per letter dated October 2011.

### **Proxy Voting**

The manager has sole responsibility for voting proxies of shares of companies in the portfolio.

#### **Compliance**

• Atlanta Capital has not made contributions to any candidates/incumbents for the St. Lucie County, City of Fort Pierce or City of Port St. Lucie Commission or Mayor.





## **Investment Outlook & Strategy**

### High Quality Growth Plus

#### **Investment Outlook**

- On the heels of a challenging first quarter, the Russell 1000® Growth Index plunged an additional 21% in the second quarter. The resulting 28% decline in the first half of 2022 was the worst in the index's history. For the broader S&P 500® Index, Merrill Lynch noted it was the second-worst first half since 1935 and the worst since 1962. Investors worried about inflation, interest rates, quantitative tightening, and recession, among other things, seemingly had nowhere to turn; for the first time since 2001, both stocks and bonds fell.
- The concerns and future uncertainty bore out in the sector returns of both indexes. The defensive Consumer Staples declined the least, followed by Energy and Utilities. Whereas, longer duration sectors, Consumer Discretionary, Communication Services and Technology, all underperformed the index. We will seek to take advantage of the price volatility to build the portfolio for the long term.
- We remain committed to our philosophy of investing in companies capable of sustainable earnings growth through different market environments. Companies with a demonstrated history of consistent growth and earnings stability provide a "margin of safety" that becomes increasingly valuable in periods of rising uncertainty. We will continue our fundamental, bottom-up analysis as we seek to build a diversified portfolio we believe will participate in rising markets and help minimize participation in declining markets.

### **Portfolio Positioning**

- In response to opportunities provided by the volatility in the market, two names were added and two were sold during the quarter.
- At quarter end, the 46 holdings were diversified across nine sectors.
- Although sector weights result from individual stock decisions, relative to the Russell 1000® Growth Index, the portfolio was overweight Financials, Health Care, Materials and Real Estate.
- The portfolio was inline Communication Services and underweight Consumer Discretionary, Consumer Staples, Industrials and Information Technology. There are no positions in Energy or Utilities.
